

What is The New England States Committee on Electricity (NESCOE)?

- A not-for-profit entity organized under state and federal laws to coordinate and advance the collective perspective of the New England states in wholesale electricity markets and planning.
 - NESCOE is the Regional State Committee for the ISO-NE region.
- Governed by a Board of Managers.
 - Each New England Governor appoints the state's NESCOE Manager.
- Supported by an interdisciplinary staff (experience in economics, engineering, business, law) and technical consultants.

What is the role of NESCOE?

- Advances the New England states' common interest in the provision of electricity to consumers at the lowest possible price over the long-term, consistent with maintaining reliable service and environmental quality.
 - Focuses on: (1) resource adequacy and (2) system planning & expansion.
- Offers proposals in connection with planning and market rule changes to advance consumer interests and states' shared energy objectives and defends those interests in response to proposals advanced by others.
 - Conducts in-depth analysis in support of filings with ISO New England, FERC, other federal agencies and federal courts.
- Participates in NEPOOL Committee meetings, ISO New England Committees, as well as working groups and *ad hoc* subject matter forums.
